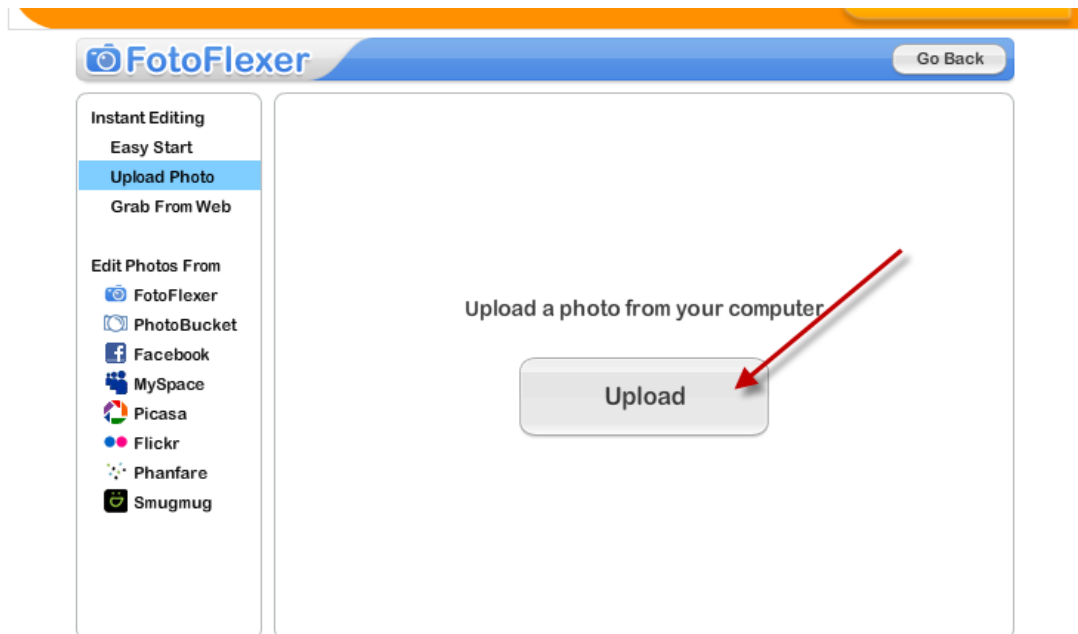
To make sure your website always looks good and runs at its best you should always use “web ready” pictures. This is easy FotoFlexer’s FREE image editing tools. (There are lots of cool things you can do but for our purposes this article shows the basic optimization you should do on any image before using it on your website.)

Go to: <http://fotoflexer.com>

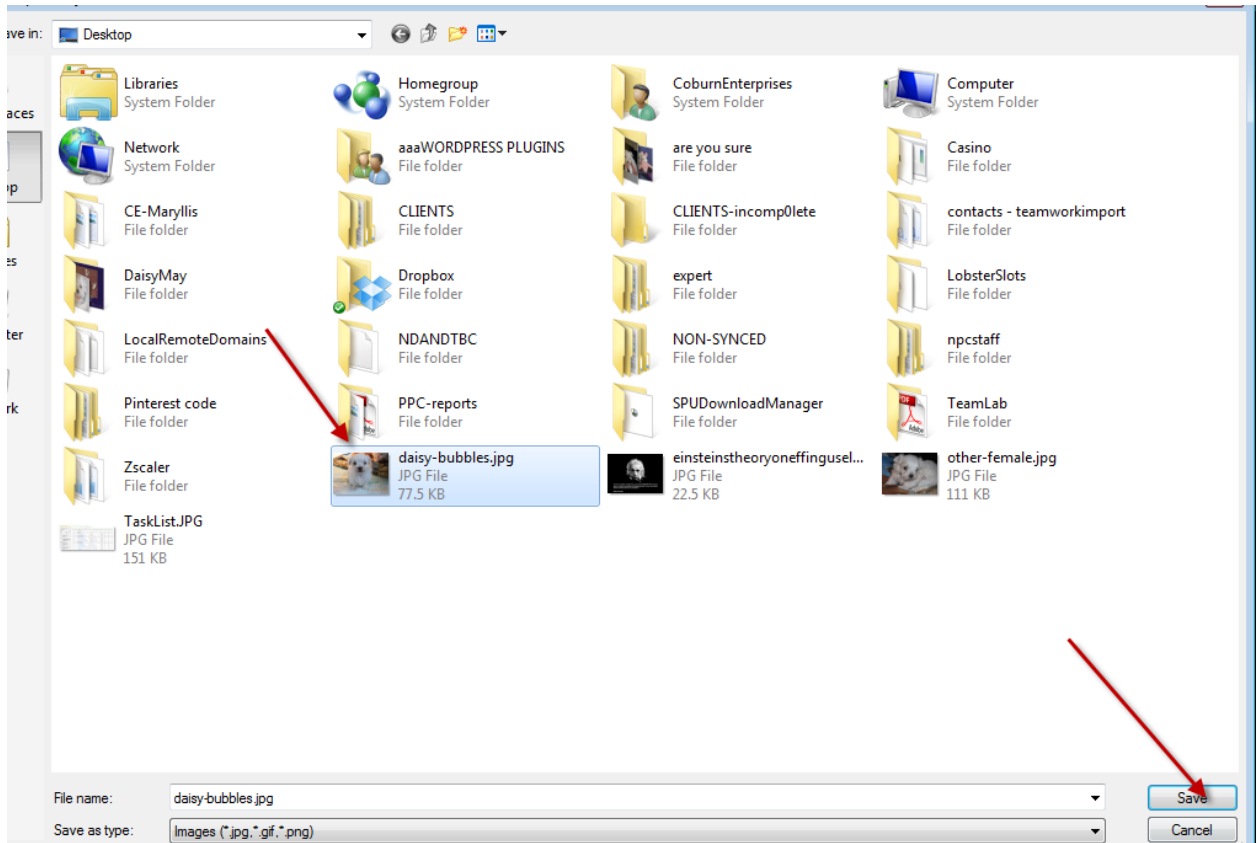
Click on Upload a Photo



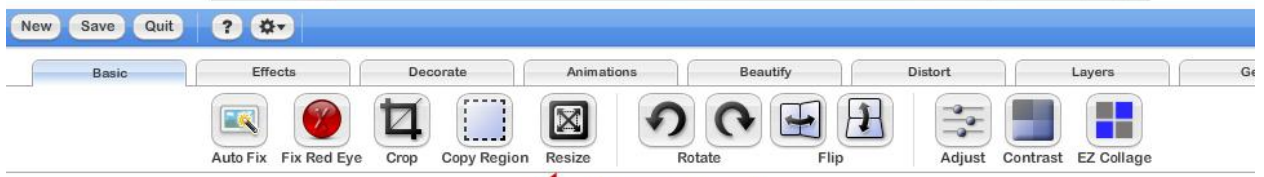
Then you'll be ask to upload again 😊.



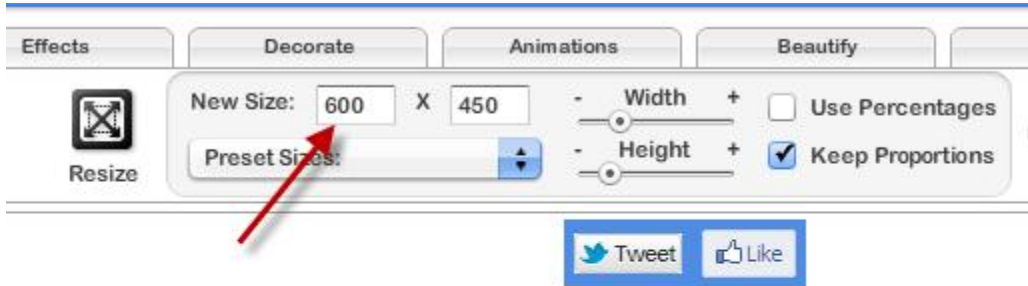
You will be taken through the steps to get the photo off of your computer. First you will find it. Then you will click save.



Then you'll be taken back to the FotoFlexer screen where you will have some options. We are only concerned with sizing. We recommend you keep your pictures at 600pixels wide or less. So now click on Resize:



Enter the correct photo width OR height into one of the new size fields (width is the one on the left and height is the one on the right).



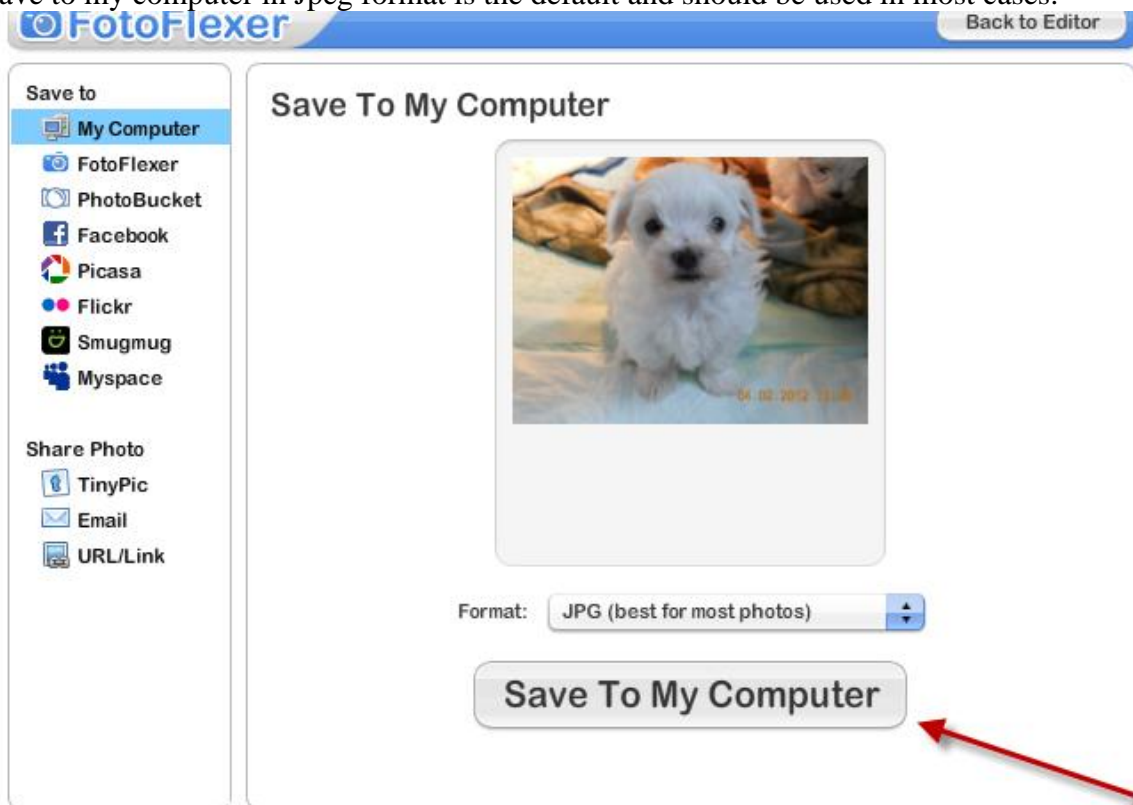
Once you have resized the picture click on the apply button. Give your “new” image a name so you can find the correct one. Most of the other settings can just be left as is. Click on Save.



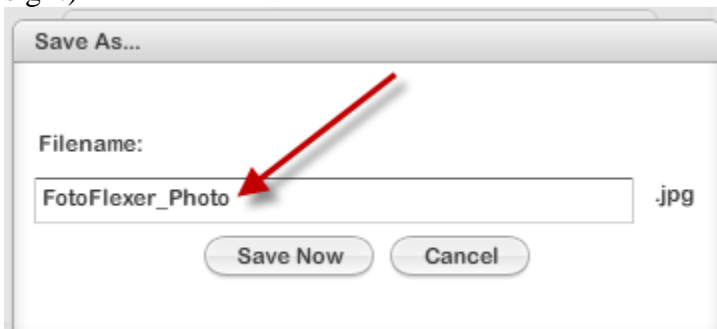
Then click save.



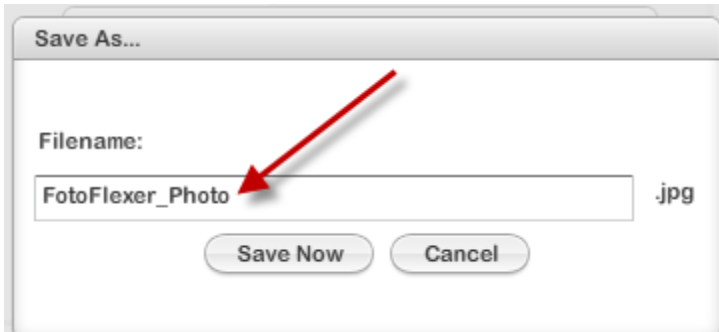
Save to my computer in Jpeg format is the default and should be used in most cases.



Give the photo a name that makes it easy to identify (no spaces or characters like the & sign!)

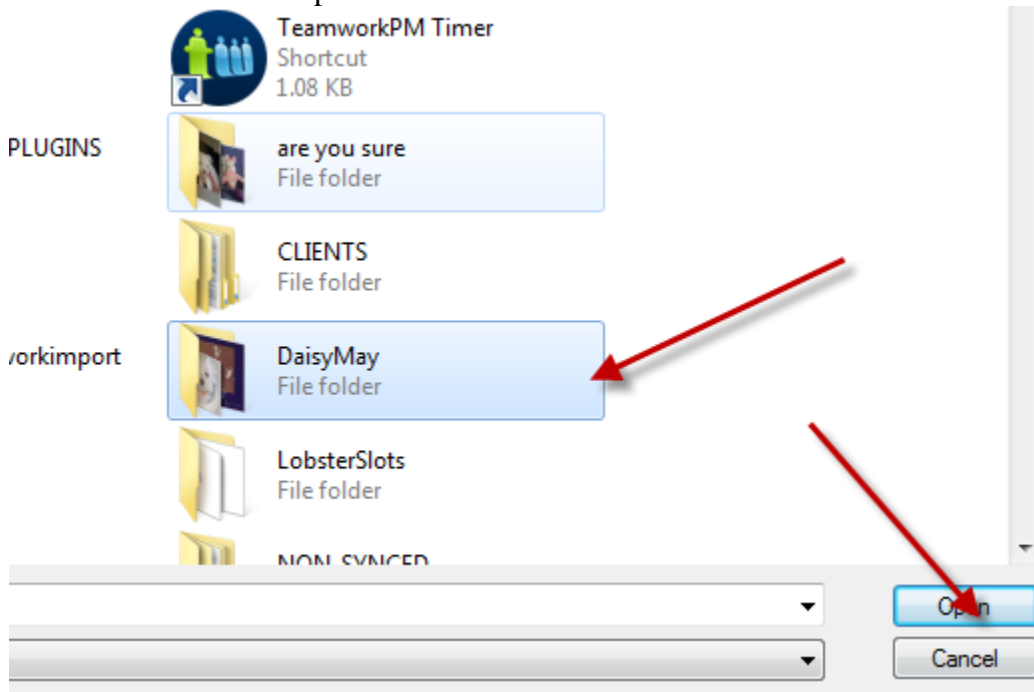


Once named properly click the “save now” button.

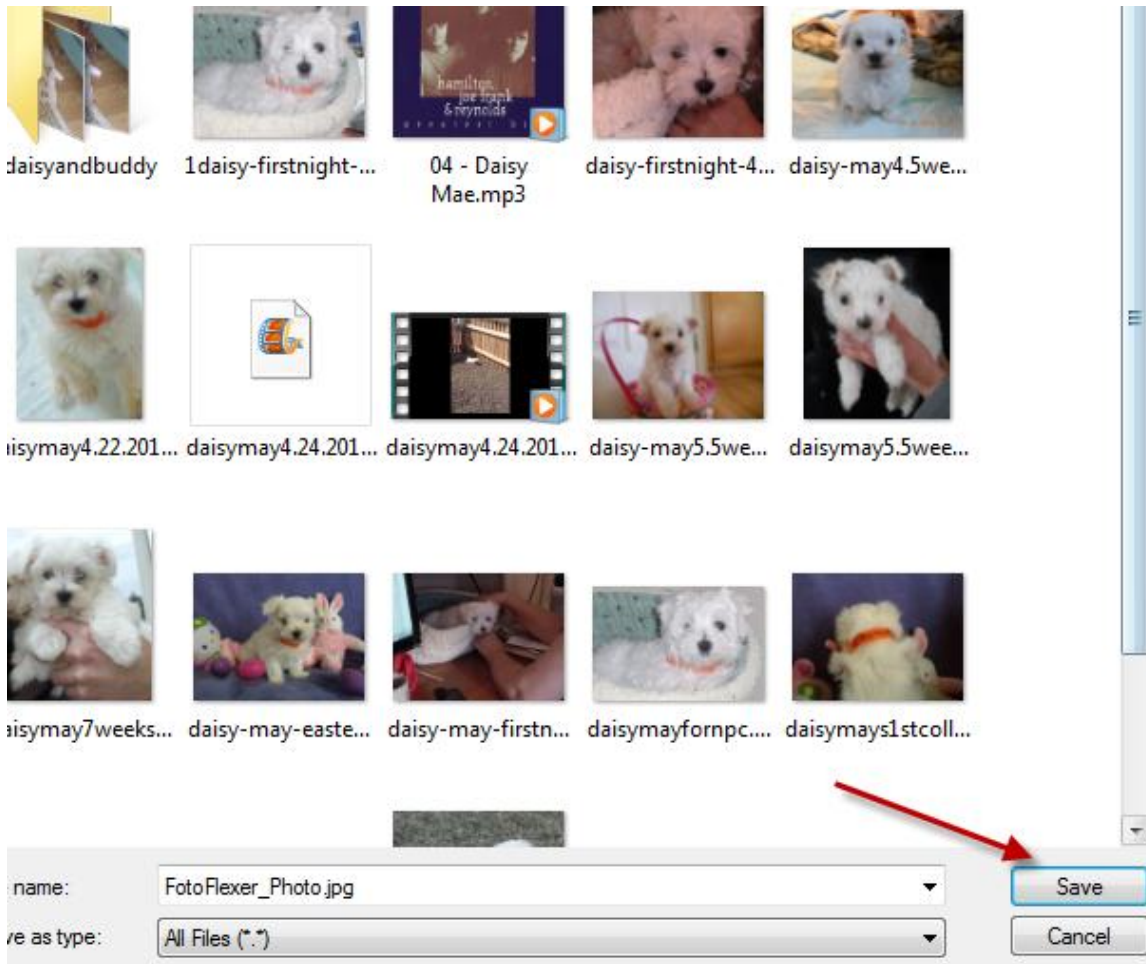


You will now be able to navigate to a folder on your computer to store this image for future use on your website. Be sure to choose or create a folder that you can find easily later!

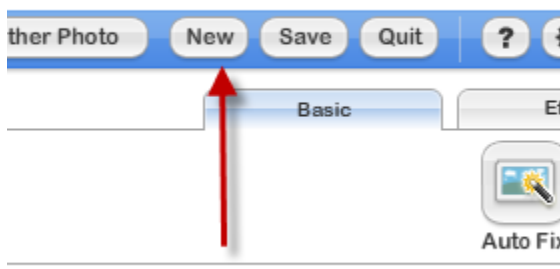
Choose the folder and open it.



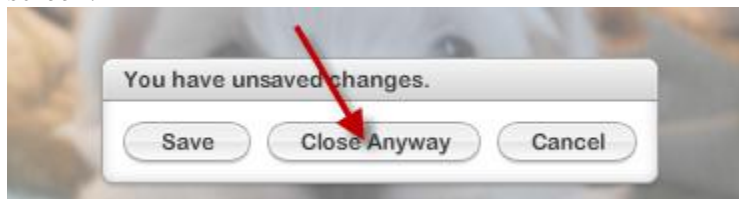
Once you are inside the chosen folder you are now ready to click save.



This returns you to FotoFlexer. To do another image click “new”

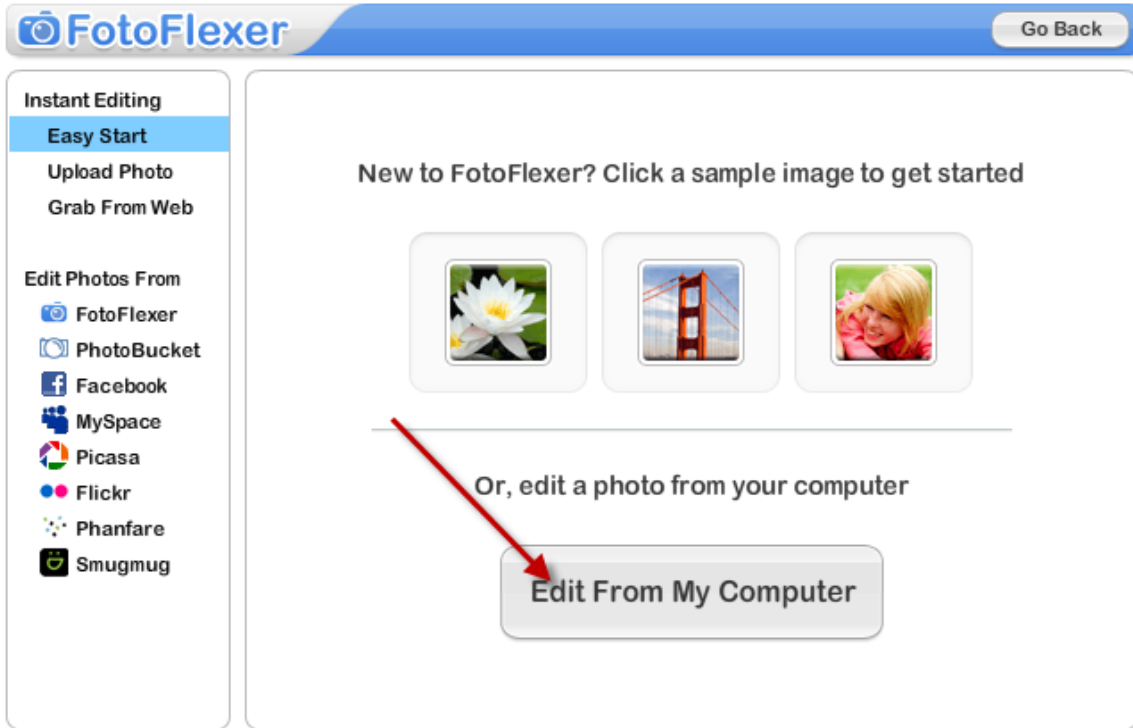


If you are sure you’ve saved your last image properly choose “close anyway” on the next screen:





Since this is not your first image of the session you will get a slightly different screen to upload your next image – this time you click Edit from my computer.



From there you should be able to repeat the earlier steps in this tutorial.
